Historic Tile Brought Back to Life! Replication of the historic tile gracing our entrance was fraught with frustration. After working for over a year with a manufacturer who was not up to the task, we approached North Prairie Tileworks in Minnesota. Roger Mayland and his staff are careful

about the jobs they accept. "We are very selective," Roger explained Roger explained. "We may take one project a month. It takes expertise in order to do a project like this, and we only take the projects that we feel we can match and where we can have a positive impact." Their process to accurately replicate our historic tiles started with forensic observation of the original tiles. Knowing the year the tiles were produced, as well as what materials



were used, is crucial to a successful outcome. Production methods and materials used in the early 1900s are either no longer available or prohibited in today's tile industry. Therefore, tile manufacturers must be well versed in ways to achieve the historic look with current technology. North Prairie Tileworks took great pride in successfully replicating the Theatre's historic tile. "It's heartwarming when we hear that a group of people care enough about their building to put a lot of heart and soul into restoring it. It's always a pleasure to be able to do our part," said Mayland.



Theatre Spotlight: Granbury Theatre! As railroads spread through Texas, former frontier towns suddenly had access to new forms of entertainment as traveling troupes of actors, vaudeville performers, and opera stars made their way to Texas. Many small towns built opera houses to provide a home for these performances. In 1886, Granbury built one of the grandest. In addition to plays, music, and Italian operas, the Granbury theater also hosted boxing matches and other attractions. Some

historians cite the rising temperance movement in the early 20th century as playing a role in the opera house's eventual demise. In the 1970s, a local businessman purchased the building and began its revival.
