**The Colonial Fox Theatre Pavilion project** is not your normal pavilion. This structure, to be built in the empty lot adjacent to the theatre, will provide much needed lobby space and restroom facilities. In addition, the pavilion allows us to provide ADA accessibility to and egress from the historic theatre performance hall and balcony.

On the programming side, the theatre pavilion provides an educational playhouse, preparation space for performers (green rooms, dressing rooms, etc.) and staging space for mainstage acts. This feature will greatly enhance the variety and depth of performances that will appear at the



theatre. In short, the pavilion will allow this historically beautiful theatre to be viable and sustainable.

## Marquee look familiar? Well, it should!

The Midland Theatre, we believe, was the first home of what most of us know as the Fox marquee. The Midland was constructed in 1908 and donned many names before Midland. It was also the Wonderland, the Vaudome, the Electric, and finally, in 1916, the Klock. The providence of the marquee is unknown, but it landed on North Broadway in 1926 when the Klock became the Midland. The Midland closed in 1958 and was eventually torn down in 1973. The marqee, however, was reconfigured as the Fox marquee and moved across the street to the Colonial in 1959. This strikingly iconic

marquee will return to North Broadway (see above) and live on the Colonial Fox Theatre Pavilion!

**Colonial Fox Milestones:** In 2011 the Theatre experienced a breakthrough: We reclaimed the interior environment. Easy to say, not so easy to accomplish. First the mold and asbestos had to be

removed. The crews of Gerken Environmental Enterprise and ACM Removal completed this work. After that, cracks in the north wall had to be repaired to control the dampness. Heikes Masonry & Restoration began repair of the North Wall. After thoroughly power washing and "chasing and filling" the cracks, the wall enjoyed a new coat of elastomeric paint. Finally, amazingly major work was accomplished by Home Center



Construction to install a French-drain system in the basements. Milestone indeed! Now our theatre environment is bone dry, breathable, and ready for the renovation of the main performance hall!
