When the Colonial Fox Theatre reopens its doors, it will provide a venue for professionals and amateurs alike, and will feature theatrical performances, music concerts, and a variety of independent/ classic films. The theatre will house a café and educational and corporate meeting space. Our plans for future programming include becoming host to art exhibits, film and music

festivals and extended performing art workshops. This multi-use capability holds the key to meeting all the community's needs.

Independent & Classic Films

The Colonial Fox Foundation wants to provide film lovers the opportunity to enjoy first rate films in the comfort on an intimate, inviting and cosmopolitan atmosphere. The theatre's nostalgic ambiance makes it perfect for showing vintage and independent films.

Theatrical Performances

Once home to vaudevillian entertainers, the theatre's stage can accommodate theatrical lighting and stage equipment. The CFF wants to bring local, regional and national acts to perform on the stage for the people of Southeast Kansas.

Live Music

The Colonial Fox theatre will provide an alternative night spot not presently available by showcasing homegrown Kansas talent as well as a broad range of live performances.

Private Screenings

The Colonial Fox Theatre will provide the perfect venue for developing artists to showcase their start-up movie projects. The theatre is the perfect atmosphere to take "home movie night" out on the town. Friends and family will view the premiere showings of family weddings, holiday get togethers, and memorable events in children's lives.

Education & Extended Workshops

The vision of the Colonial Fox

Foundation is to establish a theatre where citizens can not only view the movie, concert, play, or art show, but also have the opportunity to learn how to create those events. The Colonial Fox Foundation will develop educational programming, which will provide the resources, the training, and the occasion for its students to display their works.

Eventually, the Colonial Fox Foundation would like to sponsor in-depth Extended Performing Arts Workshops. These master workshops will be unique to the Four State Area in that they will bring together accomplished artists and interested students to share in a creative collaboration over a one or two week period.

Meetings & Community Events

The Colonial Fox Foundation wants to offer multimedia capabilities to local businesses and community organizations for special events. The venue is perfect for fund raisers, client and employee recognition parties and birthday and anniversary celebrations. The theatre hopes to be able to offer catering for these events.

Café & Catering

The Colonial Fox Foundation will incorporate a gourmet cafe in the theatre. The cafe will feature a simple but diverse and upscale menu. Live entertainment and meetings can be catered by the cafe for a complete Colonial Fox experience.

Groundbreaking Treasurer Bids Farewell to the Board

Thanks to our wonderful donors and volunteers, the Colonial Fox Theatre crossed an important threshold on April 9. The theatre was foreclosed upon last year by Crawford County for the nonpayment of property taxes since 2002. A group of contractors then began meeting to figure out how to save the theatre. A public meeting in December 2006 motivated others to become involved. Immediately, the Colonial Fox Foundation, or the CFF, began meeting weekly to develop a strategy. The focus of the CFF was on the date, April 11th, and the need to address the payment of the back taxes and the public sale.

The tax sale was initially set for January. After several postponements, the sale date was set for April 11th. At the time, these delays were a source of minor relief, since it gave us extra time to get our act together. We discovered the theatre was likely to be bought by someone who intended to tear it down for extra parking - a tragedy in our minds. We knew avoiding the tax sale by paying the taxes was the only way the theatre could be saved. This set of circumstances kept us motivated, with that April 11th date always on our minds.

Many members of the CFF put on fundraisers, sent out letters and the first newsletter, and talked to numerous people. Others researched everything from the history of the theatre, to how other theatres survive, to the organizationalstructure of a foundation. Some people made in-kind donations. When cash donations began to come in, we were elated that other people wanted to see the theatre restored. As April 11th approached, we were still uncertain as to whether we would be able to avoid the tax sale or if we would be witnessing the wrecking ball on Broadway. With one week to go, we were blessed with enough donations We could march into the courthouse in Girard and pay the taxes. Success was now possible.

On April 9th we would pay the taxes and make our first payment to the owner, gaining title to the theatre. The festivities began at 1 PM at Strecker Title Agency, where the sale documents were signed. Eight intrepid CFFers met at the Crawford County Courthouse at 3 p.m. with one check for taxes, one for court costs, and one to register the deed. First, we swarmed to the court office to drop off the first check for court costs. Then we went to the county treasurer's office and found Joe Grisolano smiling back at us. He smiled for the photographer as all eight CFFers handed the tax check over. Then we needed a receipt from next door. Finally, we registered the deed, which seemed almost anticlimactic. After about an hour, we had all our business accomplished.

That day will be seen as a turning point in the history of the Colonial Fox Theatre. We are paid up on our taxes. We have made the first payment on the purchase of the theatre and have insurance on the building. We have developed an organization that has the trust of people in the Pittsburg area. The future looks bright for the Colonial Fox Theatre.

Dear Supporters and Friends...

Welcome to the second edition of the Greenroom newsletter. **Building the future, while preserving the past.** This is an expression that has come to me several times as we work to bring the Colonial Fox Theatre to Pittsburg again.

The Colonial Fox Theatre's restoration will preserve the past by retaining and restoring unique architectural history. We are in the protection stage at present. Contractors are working diligently to repair the roof and protect the theatre from the elements. Meantime community volunteers are cleaning debris from the basement and office space.

Big-hearted businesses and contractors are helping us build the future. Many local businesses have agreed to partner with us in our effort to clean up the theatre. Their commitment of time and materials has been most generous. Pittsburg is rallying to our cause and more businesses are coming forward every day!

Building the future will also be accomplished through the development of strong guiding documents and a solid organizational structure. There will be a Board of Trustees that will consist of up to 24 members from all areas of the community. Within the Board will be an Executive Committee as well as working committees.

We have developed the documentation to file for 501 (c)3 status. Until we acquire this status we are using

the 501(c)3 status of the Stillwell Hotel Heritage and Educational Foundation and the services of the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas.

Two vital organizations for ongoing fundraising and programming support are the Friends of the Colonial Fox Theatre and the Colonial Fox Theatre Players. The Player's mission is to produce and sponsor theatre, live music and other programs relating to theatre and performing arts entertainment to educate audiences in the Four State area. The Friends' mission is to build a constituent group for the Colonial Fox Foundation. This will provide critical operating support for CFF.


We estimate that we will need to raise about \$150,000 for the stabilization of the Colonial Fox Theatre. Our Development Committee is actively reviewing the possibilities of grant monies that will reimburse up to 40% of the stabilization costs and qualifying CFF to receive 30% of the theatre's stabilization costs in tax credits. Eventually we will need to create an endowment fund to operate the Theatre through the office of an Executive Director.

Are these goals realistic? Yes! Other theatres have done it and so can we. By joining the 400 for 40K Club, you can help preserve the past.
